Course Description

An interactive case-based tumor board session--always a highlight of the SGO Winter Meeting--will promote clinical, interpersonal, and scientific engagement. Participants can directly apply knowledge from this educational session to their research and practice. This course is ideal for early career and experienced physicians alike, as well as all members of the women's cancer care team.

1. Address controversial topics in the treatment of gynecologic cancers and apply the most effective treatment methods.

5. Review the theory and clinical applications of tools and technologies available in modern day surgery to aid in the completion of advanced gynecologic cancer surgeries.
