What are the expected fellowship activities?

The coding fellow will work with members of Coding Taskforce of the Health Policy, Quality and Outcomes Committee (HPSE). Examples of expected experience include:

- Educational platform development such as establishment of coding podcasts
- Practice management resource development updates to ICD-10 or CPT coding references
- National advocacy efforts to develop new codes through CMS
- Perform investigations resulting in poster/oral presentation of their work at ACOG or SGO.

What are the additional expectations of the coding fellow?

- The estimated time commitment for a coding fellow is 5-10 hours/month for project and activities and 5-6 days/year away from practice for the following meetings;
 - Attend ACOG Committee on Health Economics & Coding (CHEC) meeting at ACOG Headquarters in July and December
 - o Attendance at the CPT editorial and AMA RUC meetings as needed
 - Attend the SGO Coding Course at the SGO Annual Meeting
 - Attend SGO Coding Webinars

What is the application process?

- Complete the online application. Applications must be submitted by December 31, 2018
- Attestation by Program Director or Chair is required, confirming support for the applicant to commit the time required for participation.
- Fellowship selection will be performed by the Coding Taskforce leadership team.

The first Coding Fellowship recipient will be selected in January 2019 and will receive a complementary registration to attend the SGO Coding Course on March 15, 2019 in Honolulu, HI,
