

Below is the list of SGO membership dues for professionals. International members qualify for discounted, tiered pricing in the Full membership categories. Discounts are also available for international institutional memberships based on classifications produced by the World Bank. Please contact us at membership@sgo.org to determine final pricing based on your institution's needs.

Full Membership Dues

\$665 with 50% off first year's dues plus a \$75 application fee.

Associate Membership Dues

\$199 plus a \$25 application fee for advanced practice providers, registered nurses and non-MD health professionals.

\$35 (no application fee) for advanced practice providers or non-MD health professionals, and patient advocates residing outside the United States.

Trainees Membership Dues

- \$136 fellows in the United States
- \$50 fellows residing outside the United States
- \$25 resident/student

Institutional Membership Dues

Pricing is tiered by residency versus fellowship and the number of trainees in each program. Each individual training program has a separate membership, and there is an additional \$100 application fee.

For residencies:

- \$300 for 20 or fewer individuals with access to the program's membership
- \$500 for more than 20 individuals with access to the institutional membership

For fellowships:

- \$375 for programs with fewer than four fellows
- \$750 for programs with five to eight fellows
- \$1,000 for programs with more than nine fellows

Senior Membership Dues

Full and Associate Members who have been members of SGO for the past five consecutive years may request complimentary Senior Member status upon retirement from the health care field.

Until senior status is approved, members are responsible for the corresponding annual dues and requirements reflective of their Full and Associate Member status.
